The MAP assessment (Measures of Academic Progress) helps us understand each student's current level of learning and growth over time. It is not a pass-or-fail test. Instead, it provides valuable information that allows our academic team to tailor instruction to enhance each student's individual needs. Our students will complete the test on a computer in a supportive, low-stress environment.

Once again, we would like to thank you for your participation and support. Events like Sports Day and upcoming events highlight the strong, connected community we are building together, which focus on growth, learning, and shared experiences.

Taking Big Steps Forward

Wow, we are entering a very exciting stage at Tesla.

MYP Authorization – October 28–29, 2025

Our Middle Years Programme (MYP) authorization visit has finally arrived and is booked to happen at the end of October. During these two days, IB evaluators will sit with staff, students, and parents, review our teaching and learning, and check that our programme meets the high international standard demanded from the International Baccalaureate (IBO). It is a milestone that has been a long time coming, and it reflects the incredible work that's gone into building a strong, balanced education for your children.

The Diploma Programme – What's Next

Not to sit around and wait, hot on the heels of the MYP comes the IB Diploma Programme (DP). This is the world-class two-year programme (Grades 11–12) that prepares students for university and life beyond school. Our Grade 10 students are already tackling their Personal Projects, one of the most challenging tasks that they have ever encountered in their lives to date. The Personal Project builds the foundation skills and independence needed for success at the DP level.

The Diploma Programme and How It Works

In the DP, each student studies six subjects across different areas (languages, sciences, humanities, maths, and arts). They must choose:

- **3 at Higher Level (HL):** deeper study, more hours.
- **3 at Standard Level (SL):** still rigorous, but fewer topics.

Every subject is graded out of 7, giving a maximum of 42 points. On top of that, the **DP Core** adds up to 3 bonus points.

The DP Core

The “heart” of the programme:

- **Theory of Knowledge (TOK):** thinking about how we know what we know.
- **Extended Essay (EE):** an independent 4,000-word research project.
- **CAS (Creativity, Activity, Service):** real-world projects that build balance and character.

Together, these help our students grow as learners and as people.

Is This Really Important?

Yes it does, the IB Diploma is recognised by top universities worldwide. It gives our students the knowledge, confidence, and resilience to succeed — not just academically, but in life. By starting strong in the MYP, we give them the foundation to shine in the DP.

Off to a Strong Start

Our secondary students have hit the ground running this year. Their attitude, commitment, and energy have been inspiring. As our community grows, so does our determination to give them the very best.
