Parents play an important role in your child's learning, and even small, consistent actions can make a big difference. Communicate regularly with us, not only when problems come up and share anything that might affect your child's well-being. Show interest in school life by asking daily about what your child learned, celebrating small successes, and attending school events when you can. Support learning at home by creating a quiet space for homework, reading together, and setting up helpful routines. Remember that our teachers are your partners; when challenges arise, approach us and we will work together toward shared goals. Staying involved helps students succeed and ignite their curiosity throughout their learning. Even just a few minutes of reading, asking questions, or offering encouragement can strongly support your child's progress.

As per the practical guidance from Parent Partnership in the Primary school (Nigel Bishop, 2021) when home and school work together, kids feel supported from every side. Families, teachers, and the school all play a role in helping children succeed; we are the bridge that connects students to their success.
